# The Australian Digital Health Agency

- Tasked with improving health outcomes for Australians through the delivery of digital healthcare systems
- Commenced operations on 1 July 2016
- The Agency includes activities and resources transitioned from NEHTA, and also from the national My Health Record system operation activities, previously managed by the Commonwealth Department of Health






### My Health Record usage as at 15 January 2017




# Digital Health Foundations




## What now for Digital Health?
